Nautical Terms Exerpt from *Navy History and Heritage Command*Submitted by Ted Faber

Davy Jones in nautical slang the spirit of the sea, usually cast in the form of a sea devil. This same Davy Jones, according to the mythology of sailors, is the fiend that presides all evil spirits of the deep ships, of articles lost or thro. Davy Jones's Locker, the bottom of the sea, the final resting place of sunken ships, articles lost or thrown overboard, of men buried at sea. Thus it has become also a seaman's phrase for death.

Dead Marine an empty wine bottle after its contents have been drunk. The story goes it was first employed by William IV when Duke of Clarence at a dinner on board one of his ships when he ordered the steward to remove the "dead marine". On expostulation by a marine officer, he remarked that he had used the expression in the same that, like a marine, it had done its duty nobly and was ready to do it again.

Dead Work an old maritime expression meaning all the part of a ship above the waterline when she is fully laden. It is what we would today call the ships Freeboard.

Devil To Pay an old seafaring term meaning something very difficult or awkward. It originates from the name given by caulkers to the "garboard" seam next to the keel of the ship's hull, which was universally as the devil as it was difficult to pay in the oakum (tarred hemp used to caulk the plank joint) The oakum had to hammered into the joint next to the keel. The term Devil to Pay was used in a situation at sea so difficult that no mean of solving it is immediately apparent.

DUKW the letter used for a military amphibious vehicle developed during World War II. The DUKW had a propeller for use in the water and wheels for land use after leaving the water. The official description was Amphibian Vehicle All Wheel Drive Dual Rear Axle. The GI's called it a DUCK.


Dunnage loose wood or wooden blocks used in the holds of a merchant ship to secure the cargo above the floors and away from the sides to protect it from any sweating of the plates and also to wedge it firmly so that it does not get thrown about by the motion of the ship at sea.

Freezing a term sometimes used to describe the ornamental painting around the bows, stern, and quarters of the old sailing ships, most often in the form of arms, and armor or maritime emblems. There can be little doubt that this was a contemporary shipwright's method of spelling friezing, from frieze, a band of ornaments.






